1. How would you describe the family relationships that you grew up with? What was good, not good, and could have been better?
2. What are the key words in Romans 12:10. Did you experience this kind of relationship in your family? What helped, what did not help?
3. Read 1 John 2:7-11. What does it mean to be in the Light and in the darkness? What is it about a person that reveals whether they are in the Light or the darkness?
4. Read 1 John 3:10-23. What do these verses tell us about loving the brethren?

5. Read the second part of Romans 12:10 again. Describe what it says to do without using the words used in the verse. Read the verse in different translations if possible.

7. Think about the gospel message. How does it help you apply the conduct put forth in these verses, especially among those in the church that make it difficult?
