But He's so Annoying!

<u>Showing tolerance</u> for one another is a <u>grace</u> that should be seen in every Christian.

I. The Compulsion (Ephesians 4:1-7)

Every Christian is to live *worthy* of their *calling*.

II. The Character (Ephesians 4:2-7)

There are <u>virtues</u> each believer needs to <u>contribute</u> to the body for it to know the *unity* of the Spirit.

III. The Capability (Ephesians 4:7)

Our contributions to the body are the result of the *grace* of God.

4. Showing tolerance, or bearing with, is our "one another" this week. Why is this virtue important to the body of Christ?

What personality idiosyncrasies in others are especially challenging for you to tolerate?

Do you think the other virtues in verses 2-3 affect having tolerance? Explain.

5. Read Colossians 3:12-17. What parallels do you see to Ephesians 4:1-7?

Do you see anything that adds to your understanding of a worthy, tolerant, walk? Explain.

- 7. Explain how the Lord helps us be more tolerant people?
