Pastor's Pen:

Compassion

The definition of compassion, according to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, is the "sympathetic consciousness of others' distress together with a desire to alleviate it." So, compassion is a feeling of deep sympathy, even sorrow for another who is hurting, in pain, or in his misfortune. Thankfully this isn't the entirety of the meaning of compassion. For it to be true compassion, one's sorrow is accompanied



by a desire to help the individual or as Merriam-Webster states, to alleviate the suffering of the object or person.

Jesus Christ is the greatest example, and should be our go to as an example of true compassion. Not only did Jesus have compassion and heal people from their earthly physical suffering, he also showed the highest form of compassion for mankind when he died on the cross for our sins. (While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Rom. 5:8)

It's not always easy to show compassion, especially when we feel like the person deserves their misfortune by the choices that he/she has made. However, authentic compassion is a mark of Christian character. It is an indication of one's understanding of what God has done for each of us through Jesus Christ.

Do you consider yourself to be a person of compassion? It may be a good exercise for each of us to look at the example of Jesus. This is how it was lived out. In Mark 1:41 we meet a man that lived much of his life isolated from people and had strict instructions to announce his presence by stating, "Unclean, unclean". Jesus, filled with compassion reached out his hand and touched the man. This may have been the first time in years since the Leper had the human touch of another man. More than just a physical touch, Jesus communicated value to this man who was unjustly treated due to his condition. Jesus was indignant and exasperated with those who lacked compassion for the man.

During the many years of public life and in the events of his death, Jesus showed us his compassion further. In Luke 23 we read about the events surrounding his last moments. He had been paraded and mocked throughout the streets on the way to a spot outside Jerusalem called Golgotha, or place of the skull, Calvary. Jesus had been physically beaten and stripped of his clothing, for hours. He was then nailed to a cross where onlookers watched him struggle for air and breathe his last. Prior to his last breath Jesus spoke these words to God, "Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Luke 23:34

His final prayer begged God the Father for compassion on those who had beaten his body and rejected Him as the promised Messiah. Even more, we know that His death was a compassionate move on behalf of all mankind. 1 Peter 3:18, For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh...

We have an opportunity to show the same compassion to those who cross our paths every day. Whether we spend our limited hours and days at school or work, in the community or at 18 & 8th, it will be noticed by those who are looking for answers to the mysteries of a broken culture. The real answer to man's brokenness is real Hope, and his name is Jesus. Those of us who know Jesus and live as he did will have ample opportunity to make introductions to our neighbors who are yet wandering and seeking answers. Yes, we need to introduce the Jesus of the Bible to our neighbors, friends, and family.

Some of us are still figuring out how to do this introduction which can lead others to Jesus. Here are a few considerations: 1) Engage people in your everyday circumstances. 2) Be genuinely interested and talk with people without becoming defensive. 3) Ask questions and be willing to learn from others. 4) Offer to pray for people in moments of struggle. 5) Accept people where they are and allow God to change hearts. 6) Thank people for what they have done without expecting anything in return. 7) Have margin in your life to be available to sit and talk, listen and pray.

Jesus spent time with people, sat with them at the water well and around cooking fires. He caught fish with them and called storms to be still. He laid hands on people in prayer and cried with friends who had loved ones die. Jesus shared life with small groups and multitudes and took opportunity to offer each one Hope.

Ahh, March is finally here! Which means Spring is on it's way along with a flurry of Mission activities instead of snow flurries! Be sure to save the evening of Friday, March 5th for the Voice of the Martyrs Virtual Conference which will be livestreamed in the Nehemiah Center. The event starts at 6:30 PM and includes worship music with Natalie Grant as well as presentations by three men who have been imprisoned in Turkey, Iran, and Sudan for their faithful service to our Lord. Todd Nettleton will moderate the conference which is sure to be very impactful. Think of who you might invite to hear the testimonies of these men and be blessed. Deb Hurlbert is working hard to bring this event to MBC and can be contacted with questions.

Planning for the Guatemala mission trip continues. Each of you will receive only one support letter seeking your prayers and, if God so leads, financial donations. Each individual will need approximately \$1600 to cover airfare, food, lodging, transportation, interpreters, etc. There is currently \$6,120 which came in before borders closed in 2020 causing cancellation of all travel. These funds will be used this year, but approximately \$11,500 more is needed. Please pray about how you can join this mission effort. God can multiply even the smallest amount to accomplish His purposes. Remember you are giving to God's work, not just a MBC Mission trip. The ripple effect of what we do in Guatemala will last long after we return.

OneMeal food packing with Kids Around The World is scheduled for May 15th at 18 & 8th. If you have participated in the past, you know what a fun and fulfilling activity it is to package 20,000 meals for hungry children in a 3rd world country, knowing the Gospel is presented along with food. Every effort will be made to do the packing in a safe manner. Watch for a sign-up sheet, donation box, and more information. Bernie Roidt can be contacted with questions.

The last date to put on your Spring calendar is Sunday, April 11th when Dr. Steve Fowler from Society for Europe's Evangelism will be here. He is very eager to share the faithful ministry of Art Sommerville in France for over 70 vears. Dr. Sommerville was one of the first missionaries supported by MBC, so for many years our church has been involved with this ministry. Steve will also meet with the youth that Sunday evening encouraging them to consider if God might be calling them to missions. Don't miss out on this opportunity to hear about the fruit resulting from Art's faithful ministry made possible in part from the prayer and mission dollars of MBC.


