Being in the Know

I. There is a Day (1-10)

Unlike many, you know *judgment day* is coming.

Live like those who *know it*, not those who *don't*.

You've received a <u>rescue</u> and <u>destiny</u> through <u>Christ</u>.

What shall I do?

II. This is Today (11)

In light of my <u>present</u>, and the <u>future</u>, I must <u>encourage</u> and <u>build up</u> my brothers and sisters in the Lord, without <u>stopping</u>.

What are some ways <u>you</u> can build up others? (Remember the goal)
