# Pastor's Pen:

### A Walk

I like the word "walk." A walk is not only a way to get to a destination, but also a way to feel more alive and in touch with your surroundings. A walk slows down life and gives time to think. I like to walk; I like to walk with someone. I wish I walked more. A walk is a great



word picture of the Christian life. Paul used the word when he made the goal for his readers' lives clear, "so that you would walk in a manner worthy of the God who calls you" (1 Thessalonians 2:12, NASB; see also Eph. 4:1; Philip. 1:27; Col. 1:10).

What's a worthy walk? Isn't all our worthiness in Christ? As I thought about this, I realized that a worthy walk is showing the Lord that He didn't waste His effort in rescuing me! He is getting glory out of how my life is being changed by Him and for Him. It's how I can emphasize the worthiness of the Lord more than my own worthiness.

I find it interesting, if not instructive, that the apostle who so strongly put forth salvation by grace through faith alone (Eph 2:8-9; Rom 3: 20-24) could urge those he worked with to do, and not do, certain things without being legalistic. Helping people see the high road of living in God's grace without descending into either legalism (trying to make oneself righteous by following certain rules) or license (disregard for having any rules) can be difficult. How did Paul urge people to live uprightly without becoming legalistic and reverting to rules and law-keeping? Surely, he called sin, sin. How did he deal with worldliness, and uncommitted lukewarm believers who had put their faith in the gospel of Christ but lived in license?

Perhaps that's why these verses caught my attention, "just as you know how we were exhorting and encouraging and imploring each one of you as a father would his own children, 12 so that you would walk in a manner worthy of the God who calls you into His own kingdom and glory." (1 Thessalonians 2:11-12). Notice that he says he was exhorting, and encouraging, and imploring each one. I thought of these words in these terms - exhorting as instructing, encouraging as motivating and building up, and imploring as urging. Isn't this what he often did?

Paul often *instructed* others with "you are" statements. For example, 1 Thessalonians 1:4, "knowing, brethren beloved by God, *His* choice of you" (there are 3 "you are" statements in this verse alone!). He often *encouraged* others with "you have" statements that highlighted examples of fruitfulness he had seen in their lives. For example, 1 Thessalonians 1:3, "constantly bearing in mind your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ in the presence of our God and Father." How encouraging, and there's many more statements like this in this letter! Paul also often *urged* people with "you should" statements. For example, 1 Thessalonians 4:1, "Finally then, brethren, we request and exhort you in the Lord Jesus, that as you received from us *instruction* as to how you ought to walk and please God (just as you actually do walk), that you excel still more." Notice the "you have" statement also in this verse!

How many "you are" truths about who a believer is in Christ can you think of? How often do you see "you have" things a fellow believer does that are evidences of God's work in them? After pointing out these things, it's much easier and more effective to urge others to "excel still more" in Christian conduct. Let's be good disciplers by using more "you are," "you have," and "you should," statements in our interactions with fellow believers. It's a worthy walk.



Andrew Murray said "Faith in a prayer-hearing God will make a prayer-loving Christian".



He will share with us Art's church and ministry work in Paris as well as the plans to help it continue on. Steve will meet with the youth Sunday evening, encouraging them to consider if they may be called into short-term mission work. Dr. Fowler plans to bring books written by Dr. Sommerville and a French cookbook for those interested in learning more about French culture and the ministry of S.E.E. ### **OneMeal Food Packing**

Once again we will join *Kids Around the World* in providing 20,000 meals and the Gospel through a meal packing event on Saturday morning, May 15th. The assembly line packing will be done this year at 18 & 8th with masks added to the usual food safety precautions always taken. We have an exciting opportunity to enjoy fresh roasted Central American coffee for a suggested cash donation of \$10 with 100% of the donation going towards the Pastoral Training and Retreat Center project of Oscar Chiquito in Guatemala. We are able to do this because of the very generous donation of the coffee by a coffee roaster in Marshfield, WI. Their church supports the Chiquito's ministry as we do and feel God has called them to raise the funds needed to build the Center. They have offered this opportunity to us so MBC can join with them in this endeavor. Your coffee bag will have a drawing of the proposed building and a specific prayer request on the back. If you buy coffee anyway, why not pick some up here at church knowing your donation is helping further the Gospel in Guatemala?

### **Guatemala Update**

Oscar Chiquito recently sent an update concerning our mission trip and the COVID status in Guatemala. Most churches have been open since October and they have started to receive vaccines. People arriving in Guatemala must present a negative test issued no more than 72 hours before arrival with no quarantine required. There is the same requirement to return to the U.S. with a clinic in Sumpango where testing can be done for our return. The testing adds about \$100/person to the cost of the trip. Please be in prayer that we are sensitive to the Lord's leading and are making wise decisions based on His Will, not our fears or desires. Also pray that God provides us with ways to raise the funds needed for this mission trip if we are to go. Thank you for praying and for supporting the team.




Due to continuing COVID-19 related health concerns, the planning team has decided to again cancel the Prayer Breakfast for this year.




