Life after Death?

I. The Resurrections (John 5:28-29)

There will be a resurrection to <u>life</u> or <u>judgment</u> for <u>everyone</u>.

II. The Resurrected Bodies (1 Corinthians 15:35-44)

The resurrected bodies of the saints will be *glorious*!

III. The Resurrection Paths (Romans 3:20-28)

All will be <u>condemned</u> for <u>works</u>, <u>some</u> will be <u>justified</u> for <u>faith</u>.

- 1. You probably know people who believe in a resurrection to life in heaven, and people who don't. Do you see any difference in their lives? Explain.
- 2. Read these passages about resurrection. John 5:28-29; Daniel 12:1-2; 1 Thessalonians 4:14-17; and Revelation 20:11-15. What stands out to you in each passage, and in these passages together?

What response does reading about these resurrections move you towards? Why?

- 3. 1 Corinthians 15:35-44 and Philippians 3:20-21 give a picture of what the resurrection bodies of believers will be like. Read these passages. What is most appealing to you right now about possessing a new body?
- 4. Read Romans 3:20-28. Who will, and who won't, be justified to receive resurrection to new life? Why?
- 5. In Matthew 7:13-14 Jesus spoke of two gates. Where does each lead?

In verses 24-27 Jesus told a parable of building a house. How does the parable add meaning to verses 13-14, and verses 21-23?

Are you on the wide or narrow path? Explain.
