4. What did God do the second day? (Genesis 1:6-8) Why is this significant?

5. Read Genesis 1:9-13. What did God do on the third day? What does this tell us about God?

6. What did God create on the fourth day of creation? (Genesis 1:14-19) What purposes are revealed for this part of creation?

7. Read Genesis 1:20-25. What did God create on the fifth and sixth days of creation? (The rest of day six will be covered next week)

What 3-word phrase in verses 11-12, 21, and 24-25 distinguishes the account of God creating from the evolution theory? What is the difficulty for the evolution theory?

Is it wrong or bad to accept the evolution theory? Explain.
