In verse 2 Paul gives three character qualities of this walk. Give a brief description of each.

What kinds of circumstances show you that you need God's help to have these qualities?

In verses 2-3 Paul identifies two priorities for relationship with others in the church. What are they?

Give examples of when you needed to do each one and what happened.

3. Read Ephesians 4:4-6. How is the importance of Christian unity shown?  
What are some examples of lack of Christian unity that you've seen? Why does this happen?

Is division/separation always bad? Explain.

4. Read Ephesians 4:7. What does grace mean in this verse?

What does this verse say about grace?

Paul goes on in verses 11-16 to explain the purpose of giving grace to every Christian. What is the purpose?

5. In what way(s) are you helping build Christian unity in the church?
