I. The Expansion of Humanity (5:1-32)

Even in His *judgments* for sin, the *grace* of God can be seen.

II. The Extent of Sin (6:1-7)

Sin permeates humanity, grieves God, and leads to judgment.

III. The Exception of One (8-12)

It is *possible* to live *righteously* in the midst of a sinful world.

The *grace* of God can help me *walk* with God and *resist* the permeating power of sin.

1. Would you agree that there is a permeating power to sin? Have you seen or experienced it?

2. Read Genesis chapter 5. Think about what has happened thus far in Genesis. Where do you see the grace and mercy of God?

Where is the pattern in the genealogy of chapter 5 different? What might the differences highlight?

Reflect on your own life. What are some of the ways you see God's grace toward you?

3. Read Genesis 6:1-7. What words are used to describe humanity?

What is God's reaction to the state of humanity?

How would you describe your own fear of getting entangled in sin?

How do you guard your own heart? (Proverbs 4:23)

4. Read Genesis 6:8-12. List the words used to describe Noah. Write a brief definition of each word.

How is the earth described? How did it get that way?

5. Noah serves as an example of living a righteous life in a world permeated with sin. Have you ever felt like your life is out of step with the world around you? Explain.

6. There is encouragement in this passage. What are some practical things you can do to prevent sin from overtaking you?
