## Pastor's Pen: Hope...

The mother of a man who unexpectedly passed away came in her grief to talk to me one day. Wanting to give her hope, I left her with this verse, "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.



(Romans 15:13, *NASB95*). I was glad to hear from her a few weeks later that she had repeatedly gone back to that verse and it had helped her so much. We all need hope. We should see the Lord as our joy, strength, peace, wisdom, and among others things, our hope.

Hope is the desire for things to be better; it's a universal characteristic that keeps us going. Looking forward to something helps us not become overwhelmed, or overly fearful, or bored as we work through tedious, difficult, or scary things. Having hope that we will be able to do something, see or spend some time with someone, go someplace, have something, make something, etc., can relieve stress or keep us from descending into despair. So, we hope to go someplace for vacation, hope we get a certain job, hope we can afford a new vehicle, a certain piece of furniture, or appliance, or pay a looming bill. We have hopes for our children, parents, our friends, and our church family. Hope is one of the things persecutors try to take away from imprisoned Christians because they know how important it is to a person's well-being.

Thus, when I see the word hope in Scripture it usually grabs my attention. That was the case again this morning in Psalm 71. Twice in this Psalm, titled, "Prayer of an Old Man for Deliverance," the word hope is used. In the beginning of the Psalm the Psalmist declares God to be his refuge and asks for deliverance and rescue. He says, "For You are my hope; O Lord GOD, *You are* my confidence from my youth." (Psalm 71:5, *NASB*), as he recalls God's goodness to him in the past. He then resolves to praise God beginning in verse 14, saying, "But as for me, I will hope continually, And will praise You yet more and more." (Psalm 71:14)

Dictionary.com defines hope as, "the feeling that what is wanted can be had or that events will turn out for the best." When we are experiencing hardships or fearful circumstances, like the Psalmist, we look for relief, for safety, or simply better circumstances. Obviously, there is no greater power to look to for help than the Lord. However, this raises the question, "Is hope something that only those who are desperate need?" Shouldn't every believer have their hope in God? If we are in comfortable situations, we might hope for more security, health, pleasures, etc. Hope for something better when we have it good, can simply, though not necessarily, be discontentedness. As I thought about the various kinds of hope I/we have, I was struck with this thought - who hopes just for God? Who hopes for more of God?

I realized that when I allow more of my hopes to rest on what I want to physically do, own, or experience, than on experiencing the Lord's presence more fully in the present or seeing Him in the future, I'm settling for the lessor at the cost of the greater. This good hope is brought forth in Romans 5 where it says, "Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup> through whom also we have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the glory of God." (Romans 5:1–2). The grace we stand in due to Christ's sacrifice gives us reason to look forward to every moment, now and into eternity, in which we can enjoy and declare the greatness of our God. I suspect that when hope is aligned correctly, disappointments are greatly reduced as well. I'm being challenged to evaluate where my hope lies. How about you?
