Pastor's Pen: The Times

Most of the free world watched in horror the chaotic scenes of people trying to get out of Afghanistan before the Taliban took full control of the country. Meanwhile, over 2,000 people have died in poverty-stricken Haiti after a devastating earthquake. COVID variants are fueling another round of sickness and death. Catastrophic tornados and floods are also



taking lives and causing enormous amounts of damage, and seem to be on the increase. In addition, the decline in morality and belief in God, and the increasing interest in cultic spiritism, is alarming. Any wonder many believe an apocalypse is near? Any wonder more and more people are afraid of what the future might hold?

As Christ-followers how are we to respond? We know God doesn't want us to succumb to fear. We know that holing up and isolating isn't the answer either, although it seems appealing. Perhaps the early church is a good example; persecution put enormous pressure on these new followers of Christ. How did they respond?

I would suggest that it was only a few basic truths, well embraced, that helped them. For example, the promises of Jesus that He would not abandon them (John 14:18), and that He would come again and take them to be with Him (John 14:3). Acts 2:42 says they were continually devoting themselves to coming together for worship and fellowship. I wonder if the words of Jesus to the Samaritan woman that God is seeking worshipers who will worship in spirit and truth (John 4:23) rang through their gatherings? Surely, they heard the great commandment, "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength," and the second, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:30-31).

How do we respond when times are difficult? The instructions are really quite basic and simple – keep love of God and love of others your priorities. The coming together is a key way God uses to encourage us and help us stay focused. I'm sure that's why we were given the instruction to "not forsake the assembling of ourselves together but encourage one another," through the writer of Hebrews. (Hebrews 10:25). How many things are actively at work in our world to keep us from coming together to stay encouraged? How many things, other than these loves that Jesus stressed, are vying for our first love?

It is with the importance of relationships and what the Lord wants us to do (make disciples), that I'm challenging you to be intentional this ministry year about relationships. Would you be intentional to invest some time to disciple another individual? If you have children, this is where you need to be focused first. Would you be intentional to spend some time with someone outside the kingdom, to show them the love of Christ? Maybe a relative or neighbor? There are many outside the kingdom who are fearful of the future. If we love them, we have to help them see the hope we have in Christ.

The Christian faith is increasingly being maligned in our culture. It's important that we represent Christ well, and remain ready to give an answer for the hope that is in us with gentleness and reverence (1 Peter 3:15). Some of us are fully engaged, that's awesome. Some of us may need to reorder some priorities; many may just need to be more intentional in the interactions we already have with people outside the kingdom. Would you actively pray about those relationships, and about what God would want you to do? The times desperately need us to be engaged! I'm confident that Christ will help us!




