What does this say about our concept of fairness and equality in relation to How God deals with people? (See also Matthew 20:1-16 & Romans 9:9-21)

4. Read Genesis 25:7-11. What is significant about Abraham's burial and why?

Think about God's purpose and provisions in your life. What would you want your final days or years and burial to reflect? Is there anything you could do differently now to facilitate that happening?
