I. To surrender ourselves completely to God (v.1)

Our sacrifice acceptable to God is the one that is living and holy.

Holy means to be set apart.

II. Do not fit into the mold of this world (v.2a)

The word "conformed" refers to fitting into a mold.

The apostle Peter (1 Peter 2:9) writes that we are a <u>chosen</u> people, a <u>royal</u> priesthood, a <u>holy</u> nation, a people <u>belonging</u> to God.

III. Our mind must be renewed (v.2b)

The goal of ongoing spiritual transformation is to become a <u>mature</u> Christian and to be <u>Christ-like</u> every day.
