

Pastor's Pen: Believer's Enjoyment

This stood out to me while reading in the gospel of Mark the other morning, "And the large crowd enjoyed listening to Him." (Mark 12:37, NASB). Jesus had just given the scribe what we call "The Great Commandment" (to love the Lord with all our being), stumped the crowd with a

question (probably embarrassing the scribes too), and would warn the crowd of the phony piety of the scribes and priests (Mark 12:28-40). Something just didn't seem right about the word "enjoyed." Did it hit too close to home?



I "enjoyed" reading the contrasting accounts of Jesus asking, "What do you want Me to do for you?" (Mark 10:36, 51). James and John were looking for their own honor at the right hand and left hand seats next to Jesus in His glory (verse 37). Jesus said no. Bartimaeus asked the same question, but his request was to be healed of his blindness. Jesus said yes!

I "enjoyed" reading about Jesus answering the wealthy young man's question about what he needed to do to inherit the kingdom of God. "Go and sell all you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come follow Me." (Mark 10:21). Jesus exposed the young man's true allegiance.

It's instructive that in these encounters with Jesus, the wealthy young man, the religious leaders, and even two disciples, did not get the answers they were looking for. Who did? Bartimaeus. And he, "began following Him on the road." (Mark 10:52). I had to ask myself, "Are the things I ask of the Lord more for my own peace, comfort, or honor, or to help me follow the Lord more closely?" I had to ask myself, "Do I enjoy a good speaker or writer just for the enjoyment of hearing what they skillfully say, or am I looking for what God is telling me I should do, with a sincere intent on doing it?" Jesus' parable in chapter four of Mark on the seed by the road, in the rocky, or the shallow soil addressed the folly of just listening. James called those who listen but don't do, "deluded" (James 1:22-25).

We live in a day and place in which we have access to a multitude of excellent teachers but sadly, in which the church has lost its influence in modern culture. Might it be because we've become accustomed to enjoying listening and not doing? I'm not advocating we make a bunch of rules to follow, nor to stop learning from good teachers. I do think, however, we need to take a hard look at what we do with our time and resources. A good start would be to let our prayers be requests for God to help us follow Him each day. Might we find even greater enjoyment in doing rather than merely hearing?



I recently read a booklet about prayer written in the 1800's by C.H. McIntosh, and a book by M.R. DeHann written in the 1940's that included sermons on prayer. I also read part of a book on spiritual warfare that emphasized the importance of prayer. All of these made the point that prayer is worship. Many equate worship with singing. Worship has many other facets.

The book "Prayer Coach" gives the acronym of "CHAT". Confess sins, Honor God, Ask God, Thank God. Each of these aspects are very important. Honor or adore God. To worship Him is to attribute worth to Him. Revelation 4:10-11. If we are going to serve God, we must worship Him and submit to Him. After we ask God about our request, thank Him. We need to be thankful believers. God wants us to communicate with Him. 2 Chronicles tells us "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong in the behalf of those whose heart is perfect toward Him". CREATION TRAINING INITIATIVE

Are you interested in going through training to be better equipped to defend the faith?

CTI can come to our church to teach a course for us. The courses generally start at 8:30 am and finish at 5:30 pm.

There is a course fee for each attendee. For a 1-day course the costs per attendee are:

\$45 for adults and \$25 for teens (BCT). This fee includes a student manual, lunch and snacks.

Courses available:

Basic Creation Training—BCT (1-day, teens and above)
Advanced Creation Training – ACA (1-day, high school and above)
Christian Educator's Conference – CEC (1-day, high school and above)
Creation Apologetics Teachers College – CATC (5-days, college age and above)
Communication and Teaching Skills – CTS (3-days, high school and above)

Harvest Ladies' Lunch Recipes

(Several of you have requested these from Crystal Zimmerman—here they are!)

CAVATINI

1 lb. assorted pasta shapes, cooked al dente

1 lb. lean ground beef

1 lb. pork sausage

1 lg. onion, diced

1 green pepper, diced

1 tsp. oregano

1 tsp. basil

sliced pepperoni as desired

2 regular size jars pasta sauce

1 1/2 lb. cheddar/mozzarella cheeses

Brown beef and pork together and drain off fat. Mix all ingredients together and divide evenly between two oiled 9 X 13 pans. Bake at 350 degrees until bubbling and hot. Enjoy! *Notes: One pan can be frozen before baking or shared with another family. Adjust ingredients to suit your taste. I use tomato, garlic, and onion sauce but if you use a different sauce, adjust the seasonings so the oregano or basil or garlic isn't overwhelming. The sauce is what makes this yummy and I sometimes add more than the recipe says. Vary the cheese according to your taste as well. The original recipe uses Swiss but I think the mozzarella combination suits the flavors better.

SALAD

Toss together in a salad bowl equal amounts of baby spinach and romaine (or greens of your choice). Add cashews, diced red apples (unpeeled), and shredded Swiss cheese. Drizzle with dressing and serve.

DRESSING

3/4 c. sugar

1/3 c. white vinegar

1 tsp. dry mustard

1 to 1 1/2 tbsp. finely minced onion

1 c. oil (your choice)

Combine in a blender or food processor until well incorporated.

1 1/2 tbsp. poppy seeds

Stir in and store in a tightly covered jar until ready to use. This will make enough for several salads as a little goes a long way.
