Pastor's Pen: Some Christology?

Recently I came across the torn off bottom half of an insert in the back of my Bible. I recognized it as something I had written about having a quiet time a few years ago. Please forgive me if this sounds like blowing my own horn, but I think it is well-written and captures the essential elements of how to have a growing relationship with the Lord. The "unhurried time" in it convicted me, and pointed out why my early morning time with the Lord as of late, hasn't been what it was.



Here is what was on the paper, I hope it is helpful to you:

Spend some unhurried time listening to & worshiping the Lord.

Today I was reminded of this reason to worship the Lord...

(Something to know, stop, change, or do)

Today I was challenged with this about my life...

Intervene for...

Strength for...

Direction for...

See the Lord in the day.

Today I saw the Lord work in this person...this circumstance...or in me this way...

Share the blessing.

Sometime during the day share your experience with the Lord with family members, or if living alone, with a close friend.

December, actually the four Sundays before Christmas, is considered the season of Advent in the church calendar. Advent, meaning "coming," has been part of the traditional liturgical calendar for hundreds of years. The first two Sundays of Advent the church reflects on the future coming of Christ to earth; the second two Sundays the focus is on His first coming as the child born to Mary and Joseph. Our church never used to observe Advent, not until a former parishioner asked me why we didn't. He thought it was good to focus on Christ and His entrance into our world at least once a year for a few Sundays. After thinking about it I agreed. And ever since I have tried to focus on Christ's "advent," His first coming anyway, at least a few Sundays before Christmas.

This also became a challenge. How many different ways can a person look at Christ's first coming? Here's some examples of themes or titles we've looked at in recent years: The Significant People of the Advent; The Incarnation; What We're Celebrating; He Shall be Called (Isaiah 9:6); The Good News; Promised in the Prophets; Sent into the World; Obstacles Were not Impossibilities; Those Who Worshiped at His Advent; and, A King: Promised, Born, and Coming Again.

I admit, I don't look forward each year, at Christmas and Easter, to try to think of different ways to look at the familiar accounts of the birth, death, and resurrection of Christ that we all have heard many times. What's the angle this year? I decided that it would be good for us to have a short eight-week (I see no need to be locked into the traditional Advent calendar) series of essential doctrines about Christ. There seems to be an increasing number of strange doctrines floating around. We all need to have a Biblically clear understanding of who Christ is, what He has done, and what He will do. It's important for us to not only know these truths, but also where to find them, and how to defend them. Can you?

Hopefully, as we together gain a deeper understanding of Christ Jesus, and individually carve out some "unhurried time," our relationships with Him will also grow deeper. So, are you up for learning some Christology (What the Bible says about Christ)? I can't think of a better way to reflect on the meaning of Christmas, and to begin the new year.




