Apply God's Word!

I. In Your Relationships (19-21)

What and how I receive, and leave, will affect my relationships and my soul.

II. In Your Responses (22-25)

I must receive the Word with <u>application</u> for <u>sanctification</u>, or it will be <u>deception</u>.

III. In Your Religion (26-27)

The sanctifying work of God's Word results in <u>self-control</u> of words, <u>serving</u> the wounded, and <u>separation</u> from the sins of the world.

3. What is James urging His readers to leave and to receive in James 1:21?

What reason does he give for leaving and receiving? Explain what it means.

3. Read James 1:22-25. What is James urging his readers to do?

He gives three reasons why. What are they? Explain what each means:

What helps you be more of a doer of the Word? What tends to make you more of a hearer only?

4. Read James 1:26-27. James characterizes worthwhile religion with three actions. Give examples of applying each action.

5. Evaluate your intake of God's Word, and the outflow in your life, in relation to James 1:19-27. Are you relying on and experiencing Christ's help?
