### Day 1: Read Matthew 28:16-20 & Acts 1:7-8.

What's the significance of Jesus referring to authority? What's involved in disciple-making? Is there anything hindering you?

Reflect on: **Matthew 28:19–20**, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and Io, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

## Day 2: Read Matthew 4:18-22; 9:9; and 8:19-22.

These men had heard Jesus speak and spent some time with Him before this invitation. Think about how they answered. They would not have known what would lay ahead. How is the call of Jesus on your life similar, but also different?

Reflect on: Matthew 4:19–20, And He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." <sup>20</sup> Immediately they left their nets and followed Him.

## Day 3: Read Ephesians 2:1-10.

Notice the before/after contrast of the Christ-follower in this passage. What purposes can you see that God has for doing this? How much of His purpose for your life can you identify?

Reflect on: Ephesians 2:10, For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them.

## Day 4: Read Luke 9:46-50 & 11:23.

Jesus seems to say two different and contradicting things in 9:50 and 11:23. It is said one is for testing self and the other for testing others. Which verse is which? What would be the results of each test of you?

Reflect on: Luke 11:23, "He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me, scatters. Reset – A 40 Day Media Fast Week Six: Missional Commitment
