Prayer Slump?

Ever get in a prayer slump? I'm in one. Sometimes they happen when we get into a rut. A rut can be praying the same prayer, the same way, for the same thing, day after day. Sometimes we feel like we aren't connecting with God. Our prayers seem like they're just disappearing into thin air. Sometimes we just don't feel like praying and every little things distracts us. Maybe we feel like it isn't mak-



ing any difference anyway. You might be able to add a couple more descriptions and reasons for a prayer slump as well. I think it's important to be honest about being in one, for then others can pray for you. It's also important that we don't allow ourselves to stay there. Perhaps some sort of change in how you pray, getting a prayer partner who encourages you, regularly taking on fresh prayer requests, or just applying plain old discipline until you come out of it will work for you. I o do all of these things.

Dan Keen, our Prayer Ministry Leader, regularly asks me how he can pray for me. It encourages me, it encourages me to ask him for his requests and to pray for him too! Hearing another person pray, or the account of another's prayer, are also great motivators. Those of us who attended the EFCA Forest Lakes District Spring Conference experienced both. The District Superintendent closed the conference by telling us that we had each been personally prayed for. Prior to the conference a young man named Ronaldo had contacted the district office and asked for the names of everyone coming so that he could pray for them in advance! He was asked to come up and pray for all who were present before we left and prayed a wonderful prayer to close the conference. How encouraging!

One of the conference speakers, a college professor, also related a prayer story that really moved me. He was home visiting his parents, and after breakfast his mother asked him to open the Bible to lead them in morning devotions. He said the Bible was like a file cabinet of papers, and as he opened it a picture of a boy fell out. Not recognizing the boy, he asked who it was. They told him they had asked their AWANA leaders what boy was the most likely to get kicked out of AWANA that year, and it was him. So, they were praying for him. Six months later this professor was back home visiting his parents again and asked about the boy. Sure enough, he had gotten kicked out of AWANA. He asked his parents what happened to the picture. It was now on the refrigerator. He said that his retired parents, without much money, paid the boy's way to Bible Camp. Fast forward a bit, and the boy received Christ at camp. His parents, who said, "Boys like that often make the best pastors," are a great example of what can be the outcome of prayer. What an encouraging account of prayer by ordinary people like us!

Then, in this morning's Old Testament Bible reading, I came across this, "Even those I will bring to My holy mountain And make them joyful **in My house of prayer**. Their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be acceptable on My altar; For My house **will be called a house of prayer** for all the peoples." (Isaiah 56:7, *NASB95*, bold added). Isaiah was speaking of a future kingdom age in which believing Gentiles would be part of the worship and blessings of Israel. Jesus made reference to this verse, and Jeremiah 7:11, when He cleansed the temple of the merchants. "And He began to teach and say to them, "Is it not written, 'MY HOUSE SHALL BE CALLED A HOUSE OF PRAYER FOR ALL THE NATIONS'? But you have made it a ROBBERS' DEN." (Mark 11:17).

Will you help make our church, and your home, a house of prayer? Hopefully this also encourages you to attend our **National Day of Prayer Breakfast**, **Thursday May 5**th, 6:30am, at the church. If you are unable to attend, or that date has passed by when you read this, be encouraged to pray, and pray for bold things, things that only God can do!

One Meal Food Packing Event

This year our food packing event will be done at the *Kids Around The World* (KATW) office in Rockford. To pack in Monroe this year required us to raise \$8,600, a significant increase from previous years. Packing in Rockford does not involve this expense since donors have already paid for the food. We just provide the hands needed to pack the food so it is ready for shipment overseas. Bernie Roidt is working with KATW to set a date for the event so be watching for an announcement in the bulletin. There will be a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Center and the number of participants will be limited this year due to the room size where the packing takes place. The plan is to meet at church and car pool to Rockford. We hope to be able to return to our usual packing event here in Monroe next spring, 2023.

Missionary Update

In 2018 we started supporting Shannon Storm and her work with the National School Project. Shannon lived in Monroe as a child and received Christ as a result of the ministry of MBC. She married Devin Long, who also works with the same mission, and they reside in California. The Missions Ministry recently received information from National School Project with their updated Doctrinal and Mission Statements, as well as a name change! They will be known as Decision Point. The new name captures the heart of the ministry as they present the Gospel message to students who, guided by culture's shifting standards, are left building their lives on sinking sand. They strive to bring students to a point of decision as to whether they will follow Christ or the world. Those who decide to follow Jesus are then challenged to make decisions to live for Him, witness, and endure any hardships that come their way because of their stand.
