In a World of Discontent

It sure is easy to get drawn into the discontent that is all around us. Think about the many different avenues through which discontent comes at us. Years ago, someone in marketing told me that the strategy of their profession is to convince people they need the product being advertised; which essentially means create discontent for not having it. Certainly, the current inflation in our country is stirring discontent in a lot of people. Politicians, leaders of organizations, people with agendas, even friends



and family can be sources of stirring discontent in us. Discontent can cause health, relationship, and spiritual decline if not managed properly.

Contentment is defined in Dictionary.com as, "satisfied with what one is or has; not wanting more or anything else." Are you a content person? My wife is wonderfully content, some might call her a "low maintenance" wife. I am much more subject to discontent. For example, here I am, trying to write about contentment, and trying to find a quiet place, in my fourth spot, and ironically, I realize I'm not content! Yes, the Holy Spirit pointed it out. So, I guess I'm writing to myself as much as anyone.

We should note, before going on, that not being satisfied with the current state of things is not automatically bad. It has become the catalyst to spur people to work for change for the better, and to develop new products and technologies. How would you determine whether a discontent is a good or a bad discontent?

Consider what the apostle Paul wrote about contentment in the follow passages. The first two had to do with his own life and circumstances, the third with a temptation that most people face. Think about what his life might have been like if he went down the path of discontentment instead of contentment.

Paul was in prison, arrested for sharing Christ, and he received both a material gift and a good report about the church in Philippi. In the last chapter of the letter that he wrote to them he said, "Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. 12 I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. 13 I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:11–13, NASB95). Paul says he has learned the secret of being content whether he has much or little materially in his ministry. The secret is trusting God. In prison he had very little control over his living conditions, and fear would be understandable. Paul chose to trust God instead.

God had given Paul an extraordinary vision of heaven. God also struck him with some sort of physical ailment. Notice his response, first initially, then later. "Concerning this I implored the Lord three times that it might leave me. **9** And He has said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.' Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. **10** Therefore I am well content with weaknesses, with insults, with distresses, with persecutions, with difficulties, for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12:8–10). Paul sought relief, then he heard God. He's saying he learned that weakness can be opportunity for God's power and grace, and is reason to be content with them.

Paul finishes up his letter to Timothy with a series of instructions for him to give the people. Like today, there were people preaching false doctrines about godliness, and getting rich doing it. Paul wrote, "But godliness actually is a means of great gain when accompanied by contentment. 7 For we have brought nothing into the world, so we cannot take anything out of it either. 8 If we have food and covering, with these we shall be content. 9 But those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a snare and many foolish and harmful desires which plunge men into ruin and destruction. 10 For the love of money is a root of all sorts of evil, and some by longing for it have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs." (1 Timothy 6:6–10). In other words, urge the people to be content with food and clothing, for discontent can lead to spiritual shipwreck.

So, if you find discontent with your circumstances or material possessions growing, strive to trust God, see your weakness as His opportunity, and pursue godliness rather than goods. Then, see if contentment grows instead.


