Do you thank the Lord for someone in your life? Why would it be a good thing to do? Why might someone thank the Lord for you?

3. Why might Paul be urging his readers to "stand firm" in verse 15?

What might have been some of the traditions he was referring to?

If God were to tell you to stand firm and hold to the traditions, what would God be referring to specifically?

4. What did Paul, in verse 16, tell the Thessalonians that Jesus and God the Father has given them by His grace? What purpose would it serve to tell them that?

5. What did Paul pray God would give to the Thessalonians in verse 17? Why might this be seen as their need?

In what specific ways do you have need for the same two things Paul identified in verse 17?
