

First Love

Revelation is not normally one of the books of the Bible that I look forward to in devotional reading. Hence, I really have to take the, "Lord, help me see what you want me to see and hear what you want me to hear today," mindset when reading in Revelation. One particular morning recently, the warning to the church in Ephesus stood out, "But I have this against you, that you have left your first love." (Revelation 2:4, *NASB95*). The mes-



sage is given to a literal church, but it also has application to other churches as verse seven indicates, "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches." (Note churches is plural).

They were first commended for their deeds of toiling, not tolerating evil men, and persevering for the Lord's name (verses 2-3). They had endured hardship without falling away and upheld good doctrine, and that was indeed commendable. It struck me how easily an individual and a church can get comfortable with having the correct beliefs and the good conduct that our faith calls for, and yet have "left" (some translations use the word abandoned or forsaken), the love they first had. I had to admit, I don't think I have the kind of love I had at the beginning of my new life in Christ.

What "first love" had they "fallen" from, their love for the Lord, or love for other others?" It isn't clear, and since the greatest and second greatest commandment according to Jesus are to love God and love our neighbor (Mark 12:30-31), it seems wisest to see this as both. Furthermore, the apostle John said you can't love God and not love your neighbor (1 John 4:7-8).

What is meant by "first love"? Charles Ryrie, in the Ryrie Study Bible, calls it, "that eagerness to please and devotion that characterizes first love." I would add the desire to be with, to know better, and to appreciate and enjoy a particular person. How is it lost? Probably, in this case, by forgetting what one has been delivered from, and allowing other concerns to move into a place of higher importance. The needed course of correction given in this passage would suggest this, "Therefore *remember* from where you have fallen, and *repent* and *do the deeds you did at first*, or else I am coming to you and will remove your lampstand out of its place—unless you repent." (Revelation 2:5, italics added). We looked at a similar warning on Sunday, September 18th that was given to the Israelites in Deuteronomy 6 before they were to enter the promised land.

How easy it is to forget. Do you think much about what your life might be like now if you hadn't turned to Christ? What would you be living for, what would be your hope? Where would you turn for guidance and direction? What were the "deeds you did at first" in your Christian life? How important were the Bible, worship, and fellowship? How concerned were you for those who did not know Christ?

How easy it is to give priority to things other than those that became priorities early in our Christian life. It seems to me that regaining, as well as preserving, this first love requires the thing most of us feel we lack – time. And yet, we all have the same amount of time. The issue, then, is what we fill it with and use it for – ouch! Mary, not Martha, exemplified good use of time (Luke 10:38-42). Jesus told the church in Ephesus to repent.

As I think about it, I'm grateful that the Lord Jesus did all that needed to be done for us to have a relationship with Him and have life eternal. I'm grateful that He asks for our love first, and not that we do more.



I Thessalonians 5:17-18 tells us to pray continually. Someone came up with the acronym "PUSH". Pray until something happens. Be like the widow in Luke 18 that kept returning to the judge until he gave her what she requested. We may not receive

an answer to our prayers because of wrong motives, James 4:3. Make sure there is no unconfessed sin in your life which will hinder your prayers. God is attentive to the prayers of the righteous, Psalm 34:15. James 5:16 tells us the prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.
