It's usually a bit of a challenge to write a December newsletter article in November when Thanksgiving is on my mind. But then, the meaning of Christmas really should be on my mind all year, right?

A Bible verse that always comes to mind for me is 1 John 4:14, "We have seen and

testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the Savior of the world." (1 John 4:14, *NASB95*). God the Father sending Jesus the Son is called the Incarnation. Perhaps you remember looking at that one Sunday morning in our recent series on Christ. It's a mind-boggling miracle. The apostle Paul wrote, "who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied Himself, aking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men." (Philippians 2:6–7). Jesus said a lot when He said, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16). The Father had to give Jesus to the Incarnation in order to give Him to the cross. What a sacrifice, first to subject Himself to life in a human body, then for the purpose of a horrific suffering as the substitute sacrifice for our sins.

Scripture tells us there was no other way to save us. When Thomas asked Jesus the way, "Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me." (John 14:6). Peter told the Jewish authorities, "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12). God was very intentional in sending Jesus, He was going to save lost sinners.

The apostle Paul reflected on God's incredible mercy and grace in saving him. In 1 Timothy 1:13-14, he called himself a blasphemer, persecutor, and violent aggressor in relation to Jesus' newly forming church. Then he wrote, "It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost of all." (1 Timothy 1:15). It strikes me that he never seemed to get over the fact that God would save him. I regret to say that I don't reflect on the wonder of my salvation like that. It isn't that I think I'm worthy; I just don't think of it with such gratitude like I should. How about you?

Thinking about God the Father sending Christ Jesus made me think of four responses that would be good as Christmas approaches, and really, well after that. They have to do with personalizing the Incarnation.

1) Receive Christ as Lord and Savior! Romans 10:9–10 says, "that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; ¹⁰ for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation." This is responding to God's purpose in sending Christ, so if you haven't, do it now!

2) Humility. If the apostle Paul could continue to hold such a humble attitude after all he did for Christ, we should too. Not one of us is worthy of the salvation we've received, not one.

3) Gratitude. Salvation is worth more than all the money the wealthiest person in the world has. In fact, it is worth more than all the money in the world, or the best health, or the happiest family, or anything! Are you thankful?

4) Sent. Think about what Jesus said in John 17, near the end of the long discourse His last evening with His disciples. "I do not ask You to take them out of the world, but to keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ "Sanctify them in the truth; Your word is truth. ¹⁸ "As You sent Me into the world, *I also have sent them* into the world. (John 17:15–18, italics added). Shouldn't those who've freely received what is worth more than anything be striving to bring others to the well to drink as well?

Now that I think about it, it really shouldn't be hard in November to think about what to write for a December newsletter article! In fact, it shouldn't be hard to think what to say to anyone all year long, right?



Missions Ministry

Thank you for making Harvest Weekend a warm and welcoming event for Brad Reardon and Devin and Shannon Long. The Christmas missionary offerings totalled \$2,131.08 which will be divided among those we support as a Christmas gift. If you didn't pick up a copy of the new missions booklet, look for one at the Welcome Center so that you know who we support, where they serve, what their ministry involves, and how you can pray for them. Consider sending Christmas cards and becoming friends with one or two by exchanging emails. They greatly appreciate your support and encouragement.

CareNet Pregnancy Center recently held their annual fundraising banquet. MBC sponsored a table for this event. They are currently seeking a couple nurses or ultrasound techs to train as they transition into a center offering more medical care for their clients. If you feel led to volunteer for the Center call 608-325-5051.

Very soon details for the 2023 Mission Trip will be announced. Oscar and Karla Chiquito are welcoming us back to minister in Guatemala! Be watching for dates and informational meetings. Start praying about short-term missions and whether God may be calling you. If you do not feel led to international missions, there is also an opportunity to serve right here in the U.S. with ReachGlobal Crisis Response, a ministry of EFCA. Hope Church has some individuals interested in a team serving in Florida or Kentucky and has invited anyone from MBC who might be interested to join them. This is the same ministry we served with in Corpus Christi in 2021. This ministry does physical work but with the aim to be Jesus in the flesh to someone who has never met Him. They emphasize people, not projects, and flexibility, allowing God to be in control. There were requests for the recipe for the salad served at the Harvest Ladies' Luncheon, so as promised, here it is:

Harvest Salad

In a large bowl toss baby spinach, torn romaine or other salad greens of your choice, whole cashews, shredded Swiss cheese, diced red apples, diced pears, and dried cranberries or cherries. To prevent the apples and pears from turning brown, dice them into Fruit Fresh or lemon juice dissolved in water and drain well before adding to the salad.

Dressing: Combine in a jar 3/4 cup sugar, 1/3 cup white vinegar, 1 tsp dry mustard, 1 1/2 Tbsp minced onion or chives, and 1 cup oil. When thoroughly combined, add 1 1/2 Tbsp poppy seed if desired. Drizzle over the tossed salad. You may not need all of the dressing depending on how much salad you prepare. Extra will keep for another meal. This is a sweet dressing so feel free to decrease the amount of sugar and adjust the vinegar to suit your taste. I used chive blossom infused vinegar in the dressing I served at the luncheon.
