Been Rescued Lately?

Ever feel like you would like to be rescued from the stresses and craziness of the world? In three different conversations that I was in yesterday the subject of busyness came up. None of those conversations concluded that busyness was good. There are times and seasons of busyness for all of us, that's life. However, I don't think it's healthy when it's long lasting. I wonder if Christ Jesus would like to rescue us from excessive busyness?



Paul introduced himself, then wrote this greeting to his readers in Galatians. "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, ⁴ who gave Himself for our sins so that He might rescue us from this present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, ⁵ to whom be the glory forevermore. Amen." (Galatians 1:3–5, *NASB95*).

Verse 4 struck me yesterday, actually, the word "rescue" is what caught my attention. It's fitting that before "rescue" is the phrase "grace and peace from God and the Lord Jesus Christ." Peace and grace sound to me like what you get when you've been rescued.

The "present evil age" that Paul refers to would have been the evil system and powers that bore a measure of authority in his time. The footnote in my Bible says age could be translated world. The evil in any age is the group of beliefs and values that exercise authority or influence over people in ways that take them away from God and His truth. These are the beliefs and values that contradict the truths God has given us. I wonder how much of what we busy ourselves in, doesn't really have a subtle lie behind it. Unfortunately, even good things can have a misbelief buried in them, buried in the why we do them.

I love the fact that we can see in verse four that it is God's will for us to be rescued. His will is good, and acceptable, and perfect for us (Romans 12:2). Thus, we can know that our God wants us to be freed from the things that hold us captive and apart from Him. Consider this, "So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, 'If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." (John 8:31–32). Our Lord wants us to be free from the control of wrong things.

Does rescued mean take us out of this world and into heaven? Or, does it mean rescue us from the power the evil age has to control us now? I would say yes, yes to both. Ultimately, all who have received the gift of eternal life will one day be separated from the evil of this world when they enter the holy presence of God. However, God is working His sanctification in us in the present. (John 17:17, 19; Romans 6:19; 1 Corinthians 1:30; 6:11). A good application question for each of us might be, "What does God want to rescue me from?"

The busyness of people also came up in our elder meeting this week. We discussed how detrimental it is to our need to spend unhurried time with God. Busyness can also prevent us from serving God. And, we can even be so busy serving God that we can't hear Him telling us, like Jesus had to tell Martha, you are missing the most important part of what I have for you because you are consumed with the less important (See Luke 10:38-42). It's sobering to think how easily we might be living captive to false assumptions or ideas!

How does Christ, through His substitutionary death for our sins, rescue us? Let me suggest two ways for starters.

- 1) Say no to temptation and trust the Lord to help you resist. When we receive Christ as Savior and Lord He breaks the power of sin over us, both to condemn us eternally, and to control us presently. Some of the things that cause excessive busyness have our Adversary and sinful beliefs or values behind them. (See Ephesians 6:10-17). See it and say no!
- 2) Ask God if you should or should not be doing various things. Many things that make our lives overly busy are good, but are not God's will for us. Being born again means we've been brought into a relationship with the living God. We can personally ask God, and expect to get an answer. So, ask God!

When Paul ends the statement in Galatians 1:5 by saying, "to whom be the glory forevermore. Amen," it is a way of saying, "To God goes the credit for our rescue." Is life crazy and stressful too much of the time for you? I suggest you look to the Great Rescuer and follow what He tells you.


Keepers of the Kingdom: Standing Strong in Today's Battle for Truth, the knights and fair maidens will learn how to be a part of God's

A copy of "Chasing Faith Among Yaks and Nomads; A Memoir" has been purchased from the Missions budget and donated to the church library. Winter is a good time to catch up on some reading and you are encouraged to check this one out! The author is known by many here at MBC and writes, "This story is your church's too, significantly so, as you supported all of these efforts through prayer, finances, and love throughout the entire journey." This memoir is brutally honest about her seven years spent living among people in a foreign land and sharing Jesus among an unreached people. MBC is planning to send a mission team to Guatemala June 10th-17th. We once again will be working with Oscar and Karla Chiquito in Sumpango on the construction of the Retreat and Training Center for pastors and church leaders. Recently a short video was shown before church highlighting the progress that has already been made. Time will also be spent doing home visits with people from one of the local churches. Team members will be announced in next month's newsletter.

February is traditionally a little quieter month so far as missions activity is concerned, but there is still plenty of planning and behind the scenes work going on. One item already on the calendar is the date for Harvest Weekend, so if you like to plan ahead, mark down September 23rd-24th. We already have one guest missionary confirmed but will make that announcement at a later date!

Missions Ministry-Crisis Response Team

Forest Lakes District is exploring the possibility of forming a crisis response team which would be available to quickly go to an area with a crisis need. This could be a tornado, flood, major fire, etc. in our area. The team would also be made aware of crisis response activities by ReachGlobal in other parts of the U.S. in case the team would desire to help. ReachGlobal is currently helping with flood cleanup in Kentucky and hurricane damage in Florida. Last year there were teams helping with fire damage in California. If international missions are not of interest to you, but you would like to help neighbors in crisis here in the States, perhaps this could be your opportunity! 


