Sanctified by Rest?

Hebrews 4 always grabs my attention when I read through Hebrews. The exhortation to "be diligent" to enter God's "rest" seems like an oxymoron. These two verses however, stood out this time, "So there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God. ¹⁰ For the one who has entered His rest has himself also rested from his works, as God did from His." (Hebrews 4:9–10, *NASB*). Is this "rest" a reference



to working for salvation, or of working for our sanctification, or both? It's clear that this chapter does refer to salvation, but the urging in verse 14 to, "hold fast our confession," and in verse 16, to draw near to God to "find grace to help in time of need," seems to indicate the author is applying this rest to both salvation and sanctification.

Sanctification is being set apart by God for God, set apart from sin as holy. It is God's will for each of us to work this out in our current life. That would be what Paul refers to when he writes "work out your salvation" in Philippians 2:12. He is referring to the work of bringing our lives into harmony with what God has done in saving us, and that would require some diligent effort on our part. So, how can rest be a part of our sanctification? The author shows that he means cease from working in his use of the word "rest" by referencing God's rest on the seventh day of creation. Therefore, the work to cease from in this passage would be working to establish our own righteousness in relation to our salvation and our sanctification. Since our righteousness before God is based solely on the work of Christ on our behalf, it means learning to trust in what Christ has done and not what we can do to be right before God. This all sounds great in theory, but how do we do that in everyday life?

It seems that this starts with some simple but profound knowing. 1) Know that we will never be fully righteous by our own effort. We should cease expending so much worry and effort, and beating ourselves up for our failures. There's rest in knowing we are not expected to be able to live to an impossible standard by self-effort. 2) Know that we have been given Christ's righteousness, so we already have a righteous standing before God. We can rest in that and should thank God for it, all the time! 3) Know that God does still want us to work toward a more holy life. It brings our lives into harmony with what He has done for us, which helps us find meaning and purpose. There's rest in aligning with God's truths rather than the world's messages. 4) Know that God will help us. Since this is His will, we can ask Him and trust Him to help us do and be just what He desires. This rest in not peaceful inactivity. It's transferred trust.

I think that most of us really do want to live that kind of life. Unfortunately, it's easy to fall into the ditch on one side or the other. One ditch is thinking it doesn't matter what I do since I have the righteousness of Christ. Obviously, that is not going to be a sanctified life! The other ditch is thinking we're living a sanctified life when we aren't. I can assume that because I'm conducting myself ethically and morally, serving God in various ways, and not committing any grievous or blatant sin, I'm good. The problem is, that's a self-directed and self-effort life, and it isn't living in God's rest. A truly sanctified life would be a God-directed life. It couldn't be done without His help.

Learning to live in God's rest really requires daily living in a close relationship with Him. Following His direction and resting in Christ's work, what a delicate balance, but also a sweet spot in which to live!



New Pipeline Study begins March 26th "One at a Time"

Nobody grows up dreaming of waking up, going to work, heading home, watching Netflix, scrolling through social media, only to do it again the next day, and the next, and the next...until we breathe our last breath. Most of you want to see our neighborhoods transformed, our families healthy, our local marketplace trustworthy to their word. For the majority of us we don't want to spend our lives watching the hands of the clock move from number to number, serving only as space-takers, binge-watchers, game-players, or even book-readers. We want to be difference-makers. Yet, as the weeks and months go by, many of us are asking the question: *Am I making a difference in this world?*

MBC had a special speaker, Casey Johnson, from the EFCA a couple weeks ago. His message on discipleship stirred in many of us when he reminded us that each individual person in the church has a role in making disciplemakers. Yet, discipleship seems to have taken a back seat to a plethora of other activities. A few of you have told me that you believe we need to take steps to revive our disciple-making efforts and help people reach others with the gospel of Jesus. Here is the next step.

How did Jesus make such a difference in this world? When we study the story of his life as recorded in the gospels, there are a number of answers we might highlight, but there's one particular phrase that captures how Jesus impacted His world, "one at a time". For example, Jesus went out of his way to meet the woman at the well. Her life was changed. Her community saw the change in her and ran to Jesus. The community was then changed as well.

In another account, Jesus took a boat across the lake to meet a Gerasene man who was possessed by a legion of demons. Jesus simply asked him his name. Legion was the name he was given. The demons knowing of Jesus' authority asked to be sent into a sounder of pigs. The next thing we read is that the man is in his right mind and asking to travel with Jesus. The community took notice. Making a difference isn't measured by a social media post, or a name on a building, or how many people come to your Bible Study. It isn't determined by a following or a fan base. Jesus often met with people, *One messy circumstance at a time*. Join us for this video series and be willing to make application from the gospels in your family, community, and marketplace.

What is Messiah in the Passover?

MESSIAH IN THE PASSOVER begins with the traditional Passover Seder table—complete with all the articles of this important Jewish celebration. The speaker will explain the symbolic meanings of the various items of the Passover feast and highlight their relationship to the Last Supper that Messiah celebrated with the disciples, giving special emphasis on the redemptive significance of the crucifixion. **MESSIAH IN THE PASSOVER** gives the Christian community insight into Jewish traditions so that the Jewish roots of Christianity can be better understood. The experience also helps both Jewish and Christian communities understand their common heritage.

Chosen People Ministries is over 128 years old, an evangelical mission that was founded in 1894 by Leopold Cohn, a Hungarian rabbi who came to believe that Jesus is the Messiah promised by the Hebrew Scriptures.
