#### What is a Sabbatical?

The pastoral sabbatical is based on the biblical concept of the sabbath rest. The sabbath rest was first demonstrated by God, who obviously did not need it, on the seventh day of creation when He rested. "By the seventh day God completed His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. <sup>3</sup> Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it



He rested from all His work which God had created and made." (Genesis 2:2–3, *NASB95*). God affirmed the importance of this rest when the Old Testament Law was given. "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. 9 "Six days you shall labor and do all your work, 10 but the seventh day is a sabbath of the LORD your God; in it you shall not do any work, you or your son or your daughter, your male or your female servant or your cattle or your sojourner who stays with you. 11 "For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and made it holy." (Exodus 20:8–11). The Lord even prescribed rest for the land in the Law. "Six years you shall sow your field, and six years you shall prune your vineyard and gather in its crop, 4 but during the seventh year the land shall have a sabbath rest, a sabbath to the LORD; you shall not sow your field nor prune your vineyard. 5 'Your harvest's aftergrowth you shall not reap, and your grapes of untrimmed vines you shall not gather; the land shall have a sabbatical year." (Leviticus 25:3–5).

The purpose of the sabbatical is rest and refreshment - physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual. Ministry is a lot of giving and depletion is often the outcome. Sometimes extended time away from ministry is important for refreshment or for preparation for future ministry. Some examples of God's servants taking extended time away are Moses (Exodus 24:18:34:28), Elijah (1 Kings 19:8), Jesus (Mark 1:13; 9:2), and Paul (Galatians 1:17-18). Time away from the demands of ministry and in spiritual renewal are God's prescription for those subject to burnout.

I am not considering leaving pastoral ministry anytime soon. However, I am not ashamed to say that I am tired. Ministry, which tends to be exhausting anyway, was especially stressful during the two years of COVID. The symptoms that I'm experiencing tell me I'm in, or entering burnout, include difficulty staying focused, decision fatigue, not sleeping well, higher than normal irritability/anxiety, and spiritual dryness. Your Elders suggested a sabbatical for me several months ago. I asked to begin in late spring when daylight is longer and temperatures are warmer because I get refreshed most when I am outside. I am still passionate for Monroe Bible Church to be a healthy disciple-making church and I desire to help in every way I can. I know that this church will be fine while I am away, it is not dependent on me but on Christ. You have several very capable leaders whom I trust fully while I am away.

You will be asked not to contact me during this time. Please know that it isn't because I don't care about you. Think of it as if I'm in the hospital and will be back when I get out. The Elder and Deacon boards are giving me 12 weeks. Jennifer and I will begin by taking a long trip. The first segment I will just try to disengage and rest. The second phase I will focus on getting refreshed so I plan to take a mentally challenging course, and tackle a project or two at home that I never seem to have time to do. The third phase will be a refocus phase. I will begin to establish the rhythm and plans I will need to begin my ministry at the church again. I will be spending a lot of time in my Bible and prayer, and read several books, books that relate to the purpose of each phase. I also plan to take a personal spiritual retreat each phase as well.

\*Note the time change for Step 5 meeting at noon instead of 6:30 PM. We will then take a break from all Next Steps classes until August.



A recent article states that nearly 70% of people called to missions felt initial stirrings between the ages of 4 to 14! Worldly forces in education, entertainment, and secular organizations seize every opportunity to influence young lives during these critical formative years. How is the Church preparing children to become Kingdom workers? You may be encouraged to know that the kindergarten through second graders in Sunday school are learning that they can be missionaries right now where they are. Crystal and Tyler Hartwig are also planting seeds by teaching about each of the missionaries supported by MBC. The children see pictures, hear about their work, and pray for them. Stop in room 102 to see their impressive map and wall display. Perhaps God will begin stirring some of these children to the mission field in the future!

One of the "perks" of serving in the Missions Ministry is the opportunity to read newsletters from missionaries supported by MBC. One can be discouraged by things happening in the world, but seeing how God is working when reading these newsletters is encouraging. Recently Brad Reardon shared there are hundreds of thousands of pastors in a closed country who desire training. The plan is for some lead pastors to receive training from Pathways outside this closed country, then return home to begin training others who eventually can train others — the ripple effect. Pastor Reardon reports over 50 Pathways trainings are scheduled for this year! In another newsletter Oscar Chiquito reports continuing progress on the Retreat and Training Center for Pastors in Guatemala. The concrete roof for the first floor will soon be poured. This is the project the Guatemala mission trip crew will be working on in June.
