## Graduation is here, What Now? Jesus Assignment

Graduations and celebrations are filling up our calendars again, as they do every year! I enjoy celebrations and stories of our students who have worked hard to accomplish their goals. Congratulations to all our high school and college graduates this year!



As we think about goals, do you ever wonder, "Why do we do the things that we do? Why set the goals that we set? Pursue the things that we pursue?" Jesus gave the disciples a very clear assignment that is transferrable to all who follow Jesus Christ. In Matthew 28 He was nearing His departure from earth. He wanted the disciples to understand their mission for life.

He instructed, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. <sup>19</sup> Therefore, <u>go and make</u> <u>disciples</u> of all the nations, <u>baptizing</u> them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. <sup>20</sup> <u>Teach</u> these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: <u>I am</u> <u>with you</u> always, even to the end of the age."

Jesus has given an assignment that has the potential to turn the world upside down. It gives hope and purpose, when follow-through is as He instructed. Let's look at it a moment. He said, "go". Make acquaintances wherever you live and "make disciples". Tell friends of Jesus' death and resurrection and how He has transformed your life. Making disciples is the assignment He has called every believer to fulfill. When that is happening, He continues, "baptize them" and "teach them all that I have commanded you". What would our schools and communities be like if the church were regularly building disciplemaking friendships and talking about what Jesus has done? He completes this vital instruction with, "I am with you always". Personally, I do my best work when I know that someone is there to help me and encourage me. Jesus is that teacher that cares about the assignment, how we do, and is with us every step of the way. As some of you transition to new classrooms and communities in the year ahead, accept His lifelong assignment to "make disciples".

As we find ourselves doing today, the disciples were asking Him questions like, "What is next? When will things happen? When will Your kingdom come?" His response was succinct in Acts 1, "<sup>7</sup> He replied, 'The Father alone has the authority to set those dates and times, and they are not for you to know. <sup>8</sup> But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be My witnesses, telling people about Me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.""

Like the disciples, we concern ourselves with eschatology or the things God is handling. Studying eschatology is a good thing. Jesus, however, is clear about what our role is: missiology. He reminded us to set our concerns on making disciples, baptizing them, and teaching them what we have been taught. This is good for us to remember.

Where, you might ask? In Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria and beyond. Jesus isn't limiting the church to start in Jerusalem. His point is that it can be done anywhere and everywhere that we find people! Start at home. As you and I go to the North or South, your assignment continues there. His point is to make the gospel known to the world, and start where you are today.

Congratulations class of 2023 on the completion of your goals. May you know the joy of making Christ known wherever He takes you.

## **Felicity Eddy**


Felicity graduated early from Stronghold Christian Academy (Psalm 18:2) in January and will be attending Blackhawk Technical College this fall.

## **Braden Williams**


Braden graduates June 1st from Springvalley Christian Academy to pursue a career in Mechanical Engineering.



When someone in our congregation is going through a difficult time, it can be hard to know how to best support them. Whether they just had a baby, lost a family member, or had a major surgery, making sure they have their basic needs met, such as food, is the first step. This is where MealTrain comes in.

Meal Train is an organized way for friends and family to deliver home-cooked meals to someone who's going through a challenging time. It's a caring way to ensure the recipient doesn't have to think about grocery shopping or preparing meals while going through a major life event.

When a MealTrain has been set up for someone in our congregation, our church office emails you the direct link through our <u>Info. Email</u>. When you click on that link, it will take you to the individual MealTrain page for the person in our congregation who is in need of meals. The available dates are listed, along with the recipient's preferences. Participants can sign up for one of the dates and provide a meal. Participants can also see what other people are bringing, which prevents your recipient from getting lasagna three nights in a row.

If you aren't receiving our <u>Info. Emails</u>, please contact the church office to have your email added to our distribution list. (MBC <u>Info. Emails</u> are used to convey information about upcoming events at Monroe Bible Church, to let others know of a need or something available for donation that could benefit a member or regular attender, or of cancellations. It is *not* used to convey information about concerts or events that are not affiliated with MBC, or for prayer requests. The Info. Email is <u>NOT</u> the same as the Prayer Chain Email, it is separate.)


