





Stepping Out In Faith

Several weeks ago the Elders and the Deacons of Monroe Bible Church announced that they were recommending to the congregation that we begin the search for an additional Associate Pastor. This news may have come as a surprise to many of you who attend worship and activities at MBC. Some of you may have been thinking that things were going along pretty well, and that things don't change here too often or too quickly. Others of you may have recognized areas of our ministries and outreach programs that could be strengthened and were not overly surprised by this announcement.

We have been so very blessed at MBC for many years! Pastor Dan has been feeding and guiding us for over 30 years, and Pastor Troy has added so much to our ministries for over 6 years already. And yet, the Elders and the Deacons have been praying and seeing areas of need and opportunities for growth for quite some time. However, we also were seeing (and hearing from) our pastors that they were growing tired and struggling against burnout. Dealing with all the things that go along with the size of our congregation, two worship services, many meetings and counseling appointments, all the ministry activities, the growth and coordination of activities at 18 & 8th, along with Iglesia Bíblica leadership support, we are simply asking our pastors to do too much.

On June 4th, after the 10:30 AM worship service, an informational meeting was held for the congregation to discuss starting a pastoral search. The attendance was very good, with many good questions being asked and responded to by the Elders and Deacons. Several suggestions were made with helpful input received. We know that some people could not attend the informational meeting, so I would like to share some of the key information that was discussed.

- <u>What does our constitution say about hiring a pastor and what role does the congregation have?</u> Article IV Section 2-B. A Pastor may be called with a 2/3 majority vote of the congregation after initial recommendation of the PSC (Pastoral Search Committee), and with final recommendation of the Elder Board.
- <u>What is the primary purpose of the 3rd pastor?</u> These details continue to be discussed by the Elders. Two primary needs we currently see are: sharing the preaching load and disciple making. A job description with responsibility details will be created, but each applicant's special gifting and experience will play a part.
- <u>Are the duties of this new pastor something that the congregation could handle from within?</u> No, we do not believe this is currently possible.
- <u>Would a pastoral search committee be created and who would it be made up of?</u> Yes, a PSC will be established. The potential members will be determined by the Elder Board and a clear charge will be given.
- <u>What is the financial condition of MBC and could MBC support another full-time pastor?</u> Deacon and Treasurer Richard Peach responded that we are blessed to have a giving congregation and are in good shape financially to support a third pastor.

In Acts 20:28, Paul is saying goodbye and instructing the Elders of the church in Ephesus, "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood". These same words guide us as Elders, and remain our responsibility today. Please join us in praying for God to guide our steps along this path and to secure the next pastor to be part of our legacy at MBC.

Child Protection Training Required

MBC requires annual child protection training certification for everyone working with youth. Background checks and training are done online through Protect My Ministry.

The Child Protection Training is a 3-Part Process: Background Check (required every 4 years for all adults) Training Video & Quiz (takes about 45 minutes to complete) Read, Sign, & Return the MBC Policy & Rules for Child Protection

Begin the process by contacting the church office with the email address you would like to use to complete your online training.

You'll receive an email from <u>message@mobilizemyministry.com</u> with links to complete the background check and your child protection training video with quiz.

*Be sure to check your Spam folders if you don't see the email you're expecting. Don't wait, the email links do expire!
