#### Stick & Stones can break my bones, but names can never harm me. Wrong!

Recently I was a victim of some untrue gossip. Let me tell you it hurts. When the information got to me, I was angry, hurt, and desiring a confrontation to right the wrong. Gossips hurt friends, divide churches, and damage reputations and relationships. The Bible labels gossips as untrustworthy and meddlesome (Proverbs 11, 20:19; 1 Tim. 5:13). You don't want to be one. We need to be on guard from the temptation of Gossiping. The book of Proverbs likens the words of a gossip to "delicious morsels," a tasty treat that promises delight to those who indulge (Proverbs 18:8). We get careless and want to entertain ourselves by snacking on the shameful stories of other people's lives. Or we get proud that we know something that someone else doesn't and want to show off with our inside information. Or we get mad and crave the satisfaction of character assassination from afar, biting at our enemies when they don't even know they're in danger. Gossip can be hard to resist. So, what is a gossip? The Bible often uses the word *gossip* to describe a kind of person more than just a pattern of communication. A way of summarizing the Bible's teaching on this topic is to say that *the sin of gossip is bearing bad news behind someone's back out of a bad heart*. This functional definition considers the action itself, the content of the corrupt communication, the situation in which it occurs, and perhaps most importantly, the motivations of the people involved.

Gossip can be Bad Information or Bad News about someone. You might have been taught that "if it's true, it's not gossip." Have you ever said, "I'm just sharing this truth in love?" But needlessly sharing shameful truth about someone else can be gossip. Just because someone actually did something wrong, does not mean that we need to, or get to, talk about it with others. Other times, we might spread a wicked story of what might soon happen to someone else. One time when King David was sick, his enemies acted concerned when they visited him but then secretly celebrated his projected downfall and spread the story that he was about to die (Psalm 41:5-8). That was gossip too.

So, in the back of your mind, when any conversation begins to steer toward the topic of other people, you can ask yourself, "Is this story true? How do I know?" "Is this story mine to tell? Is it his to tell me?" "Is this story bad news?" Also, we might ask ourselves, "Would I be telling this story if he were here? Why or why not?" "Am I hiding this conversation from anyone? Am I ashamed of it?" "Would I want someone else to talk this way about me if I were not in this room?"

Certainly, there are times when we can, and even must, speak about people who are not present. You are not being a gossip when you call the police about a crime you witness, when you earnestly seek counsel on how to relate to someone in your life, or when you carefully warn someone else about a dangerous person. The presence of gossip depends in large measure on how you talk about people who are not present and why you talk about them. Which brings us to the heart of gossip. The Lord Jesus taught us that all the words we speak, good and bad, flow up and out from the abundance of good or evil stored in our hearts (Matt. 12: 33-37). The same is true for why we want to listen to gossip. Therefore, the most important thoughts to have running in the back of your mind when you're talking about anybody who isn't present are the key questions of motivation and intent: "Why am I saying this?" "Are these words loving toward the person l'm talking *to*?" "Are these words loving toward the person we're talking *about*?"

Jesus said that we will give an account for every *careless* word we have spoken (Matt. 12:36), not just for the malicious ones. This has always stopped me in my tracks, unfortunately sometimes after the sweet morsel was already shared.

Christ also empowers us to speak edifying words that give grace to listeners and to redirect conversations that turn toward gossip (Eph 4:29). We can bear good news, be up-front with others, and speak and listen out of a changed heart that loves God and loves people who are made in his image. So, the good news is that you don't *have* to be a gossip. Not only can you be forgiven for having indulged in your past, but by faith, you also can be found in Christ, standing in his gossip-free righteousness. Jesus himself bore *all* of our gossip "in his body on the cross" (1 Peter 2:24). He died the death our gossip deserved.

With every temptation to gossip, God provides a way of escape through the promises of the gospel. The temptations may not go away easily — the sweet morsel may continue to make your mouth water — but as you trust in God's grace, you do not have to give in.

One small tool that you may find helpful is what we shared with our children as they grew up. I believe it is just as relevant for us adults. It was the acronym (THINK), to use when we talk about others. T: is it true, H: is it helpful, I: is it important, N: is it nice, K: is it kind. With God's help let us THINK the next time we are tempted to gossip.

A huge thank you to Deb Hurlbert for heading it up and to all of you who generously brought donations, came to shop, and put in many hours doing the myriad of things that need to be done for a successful sale. The funds raised will help with the expenses of the 16 team members who traveled to Guatemala in June and possibly other needs of those we support. Be sure to attend the August 27th potluck and presentation to hear about the trip you all made possible.

August is a busy month for missions! We start off with a visit from Charles and Julie Champlin, our missionaries in Brazil who are in the U.S. for a 3 month Home Visit. Charles will be preaching that morning and Julie will meet with the children in the Nehemiah Center during the 10:30 service to read a children's book she wrote for her grandchildren. She will talk about growing up here at MBC, how she became a missionary in Brazil, and what it was like to raise their children there. There will be an "Eat and Greet" time after that for everyone to hear more about their ministry and become better acquainted. During that time David Hurlbert plans to also share about his recent short-term mission trip to the Dominican Republic and Laredo, Texas. David is very grateful for the support he received and wants us to hear what he experienced. Please plan to attend this informal time with some very special people. It will encourage us all to respond when God lays something on our heart.

Occasionally someone asks if there is a missionary in need of more monthly support or a one-time gift. Several of the missionaries we support are not at 100% funding so if you feel led to help someone out financially, please contact Crystal Zimmerman for information. We also are aware of the need for a different car for Victor Schpits in Kazakhstan. His 24-year-old car frequently breaks down, making his ministry work difficult. His mechanic advises that he not spend more money to keep fixing it. The churches he works with have collected some funds but Victor still needs \$9,000-10,000 more. If God lays it on your heart to send some help his way, again contact me. Victor asks that we pray for God's provision of his need.

Recently a local couple have been added to those supported by MBC. Randy and Shirley Hagland are with CTEN (Commission to Every Nation) working fulltime with Living Beyond. Randy has led many mission trips to Africa and Eurasia working with One Hope in church planting in Benin. He recently traveled around the 10 country coastal West Africa region doing videography, recording, and photography for churches and mission outreach as needed. He may soon be going to India for some similar work projects. We look forward to sharing more about his ministry in the future.
