Are there obstacles hindering Christ's enriching presence in your life? What change might be in order?

3. John clarifies his message in Luke 3:7-20 – repentance is action and judgment is coming.

What warning does he give in verses 7-9?

How does John answer the question "What shall we do?" by three different groups in verses 10-14?

If you asked Christ, "What shall I do?" in response to repentance, what might He say?

John reassures his listeners of a coming judgment in verses 15-20. You know judgment day is coming. What are you doing with that knowledge?
