### **Find Your Community**

"FIND YOUR COMMUNITY" will soon be the new sign on our church billboard by the highway. Of course, MBC and service times will also be on the sign. I like the word "community" for two reasons: 1) Community is a value that resonates with the current younger generation, and 2) Being in community is an important part of the Christian life.

Why does "community" resonate with young adults? Perhaps it's because of the cultural changes they have experienced growing up. Social media has become a large part of what would normally be face-to-face, or at least voice-to-voice, social interaction with others. Social media interaction doesn't replace what takes place in that kind of personal communication. God made us to function in community. Someone said even God is "in community," (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). Isolation is used in the prison system for punishment, and it is one of the most effective tools interrogators and torturers use!

Meriam-Webster online dictionary defines community as, "a unified body of individuals: such as a: the people with common interests living in a particular area; b: the area itself; c: a group of people with a common characteristic or interest living together within a larger society;" it goes on to include groups of people that have a common profession, history, are linked by a common policy, etc. The theme is "in common" and "together." Even introverts value time spent with those they have things in common (just not as much time I).

Secondly, community is important not just because we are human beings, but because of what it means to live the Christian life. The first Christians understood this. "They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." (Acts 2:42, *NASB*). Fellowship is a Bible-word for community. Paul wrote to Philemon, "and I pray that the *fellowship* of your faith may become effective through the knowledge of every good thing which is in you for Christ's sake." (Philemon 1:6, italics added). The apostle John opened his first letter with, "what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have *fellowship* with us; and indeed, our *fellowship* is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ." (1 John 1:3, italics added). Learning, encouragement, support, and so much more come from being together as Christ-followers.

Obviously, Christians share a lot in common. Ephesians 4:4–6, says, "There is one body and one Spirit, just as also you were called in one hope of your calling; <sup>5</sup> one Lord, one faith, one baptism, <sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all."

What does it mean to live "in community"? All the New Testament "one another" exhortations: to love, accept, tolerate, admonish, forgive, build up, serve, be subject to, and bear one another's burdens, to name a few, is a good start. The "one another's" all require having something in common and being together.

A larger aspect of being in community at MBC is being in the Sunday morning worship service. There the common experience is the worship of our Lord. Another more personal community is serving in a ministry, where the common experience is the work of ministry. The concepts of partnership, sharing, and belonging are in the Greek word for fellowship. Another even more personal level of community is to be in a small group in which God's Word is opened and application gained and sharing and prayer for one another takes place. Are you experiencing these kinds of community? We provide opportunities for you to be in community in each of these levels through the various ministries at MBC. Our ministries are not the only place you can find faith-growing community; the important thing is that you have it, and that you welcome others to join you, especially those seeking community.

I think the hope of finding an authentic community is one of the reasons some people are finding their way into, or back to, the church today. Let's give them an opportunity!

As we settle back into our fall ministries here at MBC, others are doing the same elsewhere. Daniel Jezowski will soon be on his way back to Papua New Guinea while Charles and Julie Champlin are already in Brazil. A number of those we support, including Hunter and Brittany Hancock, are involved with campus ministries and very busy with the return of students for the fall semester. What a blessing to have all of them here over the last couple months, to get to know them personally, and to learn about their ministries. Let's remember to pray for them and their work.

You may remember a couple years ago MBC helped fund nasal polyp surgery for Joseph Malumbi, an alumnus of Action Pastors College in Zambia where Tracy Singleton taught and served as a missionary. The surgery was successful but later Joseph was diagnosed with an aggressive cancer in his throat. Since retirement, Tracy has stayed in close contact with him via Messenger and texts to be an encouragement and now is focused on helping Joseph die with a strong hope in the Lord. One of Joseph's concerns is a house for his wife Bridget and their 3 children. For \$2,000 a two-room cinder block house can be built on land they own. There will be no electricity or plumbing which is not uncommon for Zambia. Tracy also hopes to provide money for them to live on during this transitional time, and for a scholarship for theological training for the young man pastoring the church Joseph has planted. Tracy recently wrote, "It has been a great privilege to be Joseph's friend and mentor. He's such an exceptional man." If you feel compassion for Joseph and his family during this very difficult time, you can help by writing a check to ACTION International and write Acct # 43039M or Joseph Malumbi on the memo line or in a note with the check. Checks can be left in the Missions mailbox or in the office so they can all be mailed together. Tracy will oversee the administration of these funds. If you can contribute before November it would be helpful. Tracy and Karen plan to return to Zambia in November where he will teach a class and they will attend the annual graduation ceremony of Baptist Theological Seminar, which credentials Action Pastors College as part of its nonresidential Bible school program. Not all can give financially, but we all can pray for these needs.

For those who like to plan ahead, the Pleasant View birthday party has been scheduled for Tuesday, November 14th. There will be a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Center and a collection box for bingo prizes later in October. We will honor PV policy that all volunteers having contact with residents must be 12 years or older. Younger children will be allowed to participate by singing or playing an instrument during the program but will not be allowed to push wheelchairs or have direct contact with residents. Thank you for understanding their need for such a policy.


