Application Questions - These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out answers to these questions will help drive home the point. They are designed to be discussed in your home, with other believers, and in a Life Group for even more benefit.

1. Read Luke 10:25-37. What does the text reveal about the lawyer? What was his real issue and how did Jesus help him see it?

It's easy for church people to justify themselves, at least subconsciously, worthy of eternal life. In what ways are you tempted to do this?

Ask God to help you evaluate your love for Him and your love for others. What is He telling you?

2. Read Luke 10:38-42. What is right in Mary's, and not right in Martha's, response to the presence of Jesus?

5. Compare what the people do, or ask about doing, with the answers Jesus gives in this passage (Luke 10:25-11:13). What is Jesus emphasizing?
