4. How is it that we can call Mary's visit to Elizabeth in Luke 1:39-45 a miraculous confirmation of Gabriel's message?

How might God confirm the truthfulness of the gospel to those struggling today to believe it?

5. Read Mary's response to Elizabeth in Luke 1:46-55. What does she highlight about God? What groups does she see God treat differently and why might God do that?
