## A Savior is Born!

## I. The Placing (1-7)

God determined that the Savior would be born in <u>hardship</u>, and <u>humble</u> and <u>obscure</u> circumstances.

## II. The Proclaiming (8-14)

God supernaturally sent a message to <u>lowly</u> men to announce the birth of the <u>world's Savior</u>.

## III. The Proving (15-20)

The men who received the message from God personally <u>verified</u>, then *testified* to the birth of the Savior.

What does the angel tell the shepherds?

What's the significance of a multitude of angels appearing after the first angel gave his message?

List some ways in which the angel's message is good news for you?

3. Read Luke 2:15-20. How many different responses to the angel's message do you see in these verses?

Have you seen or experienced such responses to the gospel of Christ?
