2. Read Luke 17:5-10. How does Jesus' master-slave illustration answer the disciples' request to increase their faith?

3. Read Luke 17:11-19. What's significant about Jesus' response to the request of the lepers, and their response to what He told them to do?

Consider the servant in Jesus' illustration, and the lepers in His demonstration. What is Jesus' message to you concerning your faith?

What is an example of faith like this in your life?

4. How did Jesus answer the Pharisees' question as to when the kingdom of God was coming in Luke 17:20-21?

5. Read Luke 17:22-37. What did Jesus tell His disciples His coming would be like, and what would happen before His coming?

Do you see any of the things described in verses 26-30 today? Explain. How does it affect you?
