What did the people do when the colt was brought to Jesus? (v. 35-36) What did this mean? (See also Zechariah 9:9)

How did the crowd respond, and why? How did the Pharisees respond, and why?

2. Think about what Jesus was doing and the different responses of the people. What does your life reveal you believe about Jesus as Lord?

3. Read Luke 19:41-48. What upset Jesus about Jerusalem? (41-44)

Why was the future event He told them about going to happen?

What was Jesus upset about and what did He do in verses 45-47?

What reactions did this bring about? (47-48)

4. If Jesus were to enter our church what might He be upset about?

If Jesus were to enter your home, what might He be upset about?

5. Reflect on what Jesus did in this passage, then what He will do a few days later. What encourages you, whether your spiritual condition is good, or not?
