Application Questions - These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out answers to these questions will help drive home the point. They are designed to be discussed in your home, with other believers, and in a Life Group for even more benefit.

1. Read Luke 22:39-46. Where is Jesus, what does He want, and why?

Compare the prayer of Jesus to that of His disciples and the results of each.

What does this tell you about Jesus? About yourself?

2. Luke 22:47-53 records the account of Judas betraying Jesus. Why might he have used a kiss to betray Jesus, and why would it be so dastardly?

What did the way in which the "crowd" came show about them?

What did the disciple's use of his sword, and Jesus' response, show about them?

Can you see yourself in anyone in this section? Explain.

3. What three different sides of Peter do you see in Luke 22:54-62? What caused the changes between what he was doing each time?

What's one lesson you can learn from Peter's example? From the example of Jesus?

4. Read Luke 22:63-65. Why would those guarding Jesus do what they did to Him? Why would He just take it?

What application can you take from Luke 22:39-65 that is glorifying to the Lord, and faith building for you?
