What Does Pastor Kevin Do?

This may be a question you have, and perhaps have even asked since Pastor Kevin started. First, Pastor Kevin was hired to help Pastor Troy and me. We intentionally weren't detailed in Pastor Kevin's job description when we hired him. We wanted to put all the pastoral responsibilities on the table and sort out who would be responsible for



what, based on experience, gifting, and ministry passion. We hired Pastor Kevin based on strong Christian character, theological and philosophical alignment, and skill and experience in ministry. We believe we made a good hire in that respect.

Where is help needed? Pastor Troy's title had been Family Ministry Pastor. He has spent a lot of time helping build two student ministries' leadership teams, teaching/ facilitating the Pipeline class Sunday mornings, and providing leadership and direction to the new and unforeseen ministries at 18 & 8th. My weeks are full with weekly sermon preparation, and the day to day business of church leadership and congregational and administrative needs. Thus far Pastor Kevin has been sitting in on classes, getting to know people, and evaluating our ministries with "fresh eyes." He is rightly asking how we are approaching our mission of making disciples in our various ministries and giving thought and prayer to how we might take the next step of improvement.

Our mission is to make disciples (Matt. 28:19). We make disciples of Jesus by bringing people to Him for saving faith (evangelism), and by helping them follow Him in sanctification (spiritual growth). We are to do this as individuals but also by joining together with others into teams, and as a whole body of believers. As pastors our responsibility is to equip you for the ministry of disciple-making (Eph. 4:12). It's this "equipping" that we've had to set aside too often because of other urgent ministry needs. As we move forward, we hope to help equip those in our congregation who desire to be disciple-makers, whether as individuals or as team members.

I like the way Pastor Kevin keeps asking about our goal(s) and mission. He asked me how we define a disciple last week. My short answer, "A disciple is someone who has an overflowing walk with Jesus." By that I mean his or her walk with the Lord spills out in every area of their life; everything they do points to Christ (2 Peter 3:18). Disciple-making (evangelism, sanctification, worship, Christian service) isn't a program, it's the product of a vibrant walk with Christ.

At this point in our process of discerning who takes which responsibility, we've decided Pastor Kevin's focus areas will be small groups (including Life Groups, Bible studies, and mentoring), Men's Ministry, and Pipeline. He will also preach with some regularity. Pastor Troy's focus areas will be children's and student ministry (including Sunday School, Awana, Ignite, and Fusion), and Outreach (including missions - local and beyond, and 18 & 8th). I will continue to do most of the preaching, give overall leadership, and develop what we hope to be an ongoing leadership development curriculum.

Pastor Troy and Pastor Kevin will both have the title Associate Pastor. Building families will be something we all intentionally integrate into our ministry focus areas. We hope and pray that this reorganization will also alleviate the heavy ministry loads on our Elders, and free them up to fulfill some of the Elder responsibilities they are called to do.

As pastors, our emphasis will be to help equip you for what God has called you to do. We want to help each of you walk closer with Christ so that you have an overflowing life. If you already have an overflowing life, we're glad you're on our team! If not, please join us, I think you will find there is no greater joy and satisfaction in life than living the life you were meant to live.

It costs \$9,600 to hold this event which provides 30,000 meals and the gospel to the world's poorest people. If the Lord lays it upon your heart to contribute to this project, please look for the labeled wooden donation box behind the sanctuary beginning this month. Checks need to be made out to **Kids Around the World** (KATW), not MBC. This is a big step in faith to seek such a large sum, but our God is able to do far more than we can imagine, and we believe it is pleasing to Him when we provide food for the starving, along with the Good News, and that He will bless our efforts.

A day trip to visit Shepherds College is in the planning, hopefully before the end of this semester. Kevin Phillips recently let us know that the College was honored to be featured on a national broadcast called Small Town Big Deal. You are strongly encouraged to watch this uplifting 19 minute show! It will leave you blessed to know MBC supports such an impactful ministry to those with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Watching the show is a few minutes well spent.

A one time gift was recently sent to Decision Point, the organization Devin and Shannon Long serve under , for a new campaign titled "I Have Decided". The funds will be used to help Christian students lead a weeklong outreach at their school. The gift we sent will go toward students' training, Bibles, t-shirts, flyers, and other resources. Students as young as 12 years old and some who haven't even been saved for a whole year boldly tell their whole school that they have decided to follow Jesus, sharing their testimony with their peers. This student evangelism campaign seeks to equip 10,000 students in 25 cities to win peers for Christ as well as launch podcasts and online gospel distribution through social media internationally. As we approach our celebration of Easter, I was thinking of all the things Jesus went through for mankind. Jesus was betrayed by Judas with a kiss and Judas was given 30 pieces of silver for doing that to our Savior. Peter denied knowing Jesus. Jesus was mocked by the soldiers. He was beaten severely. In closing, as we approach Easter, read and meditate on the life of Jesus. Thank Him for all He is doing for us and all He has done for us.


