Saved to Serve

Jennifer, my wife, recently came across a fascinating video post by an apiarist (beekeeper). The beekeeper found a bee that was helplessly wrapped in a spider web. Out of curiosity she decided to lay the bee in the web beside a beehive. She had thirteen beehives so she had no way of knowing which hive it belonged to but thought she would see what would happen. Immediately, bees landed by the



distressed bee and began pulling at the sticky web. Multiple bees worked at it until the bee was completely freed from the webbing. The apiarist's comment was something to the effect of how great it would be if people treated others who needed help like that.

Jennifer and I thought that this is a good example of the way Christians should treat others (Matthew 7:12, the "Golden Rule"), especially those in need, and certainly those within their local body. There are ample New Testament exhortations to help others in their need. One example is in 1 John. It says, "But whoever has the world's goods, and sees his brother in need and closes his heart against him, how does the love of God abide in him? ¹⁸ Little children, let us not love with word or with tongue, but in deed and truth." (1 John 3:17–18, *NASB95*). When someone in church steps in to help another, it's a beautiful thing to see or hear about. When the opposite happens, nobody shows up, a hurting person often feels isolated. Unfortunately, it happens, and I'm as guilty as anyone of failing to show up with help.

In the upcoming ministry year, an area of focus will be **serving God by serving others**. We'll be unpacking that this fall, but for now I wonder why we don't see the needs of others better and respond with help. No doubt busyness would be suggested as the chief cause. It's always the first answer for why Christians aren't practicing Christian growth disciplines, or serving, or reaching out to those who have yet to believe. The word selfishness also surfaces as a reason, which is sometimes also attached to busyness. Lack of communication (I didn't know), lack of relationships, or lack of resources are among other reasons suggested for why Christians don't do things they know they should.

I'm sure there's no simple answer. Perhaps that's why a short portion of an interview I heard on the radio this week motivated me to find and listen to the full podcast. The author of a ministry and curriculum that started 21 years ago is on a mission to instill character in children, especially humility, respect, and resiliency. The author traces our current cultural state of widespread disrespect to the introduction and adoption of the belief that began in the 1970's that we need to build self-esteem in children. No one recognized it at the time, but its outcome has not been better adjusted young people, but self-centeredness, and the gradual erasing of humility, compassion, and respect.

Obviously, there's a lot more to this, but it makes me wonder if this is why serving others seems to be less and less common. I'm challenged to think about how we can reverse self-centeredness in our lives and in our church. How do we cultivate humility? How do we learn to respect those who don't believe, or those who hold different views on issues not essential to Christianity? How do we develop courage to speak up, and know when we should? How can we emphasize speaking always in respectful ways?

As I think about the illustration of the bees, a few thoughts come to mind. It didn't matter why the bee got caught, just that it needed help. Bees don't condemn other bees for being stupid, making bad decisions, or even blame spiders for making webs! There are "spiders" who work through people all around us with webs of untruths that catch us and those around us. The worst thing we can do is move away from one another. To leave someone alone when they're entangled, or vulnerable, is not living like Christ wants us to live. Jesus set the example, "We know love by this, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren." (1 John 3:16). So, have you helped someone out of a spider web lately?

If you are 11 years old or older, and plan to work with youth in any capacity at MBC, you need to complete Annual Child Protection Training.

Summer months are the best time to do this!

Training consists of online video certification; reading the MBC Policy & Rules, signing, and returning the last page; and completing background checks on all adults every two years.


