

Joy

You've probably heard me say it, and I've probably written it as well, Christmas is not a favorite holiday of mine. That's sad, and I'm not proud to admit it. What could be more important to celebrate (other than Easter) than the holiday set aside to celebrate the arrival of the Son of God on the earth to be our Savior? I've



allowed the commercialization of Christmas to skew my attitude. The extra busyness of parties and presents that don't reflect what should be the joy of Christmas too easily takes my attention sideways.

In my through-the-Bible reading, the word "joy" jumped out the other day. Perhaps it was partly because the Christmas season is upon us. I was in John 17, "But now I come to You; and these things I speak in the world so that they may have My joy made full in themselves." (John 17:13, *NASB95*). It jumped out because I had read of Jesus using the word "joy" the two previous days in chapter 16, and in chapter 15. This would have all been during His last evening with them, the cross literally only hours away, and two of the three times in these chapters Jesus called it "My joy"!

In John 17 Jesus is praying to the Father, presumably in a way that the disciples overhear it. His prayer is that His joy be "made full" in them. In John 15 Jesus said, "These things I have spoken to you so that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made full." (John 15:11). Jesus is telling His disciples that it is having His joy that will bring fullness to their joy. What kind of joy is this, He's going to die an excruciatingly painful death!

The context of John 15:11 is abiding in Christ for fruitfulness. It is abiding in His love by keeping His commandments, and His commandment to love one another in particular. His sacrificial love is their example. The context of John 17:13 is His desire for the disciples to bring glory to God by following His Word while living in the world.

So, what is His joy? Hebrews 12:2 seems to pull it together. The author is encouraging the brethren to lay aside the things that hinder their endurance in the race set before them by, "fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:2). The joy of Jesus is opening the door to eternal life for whosoever will come, even though it's at great personal cost to Him. This is what Jesus will do in only a few hours from making the statements in John's gospel!

Jesus called it His joy, He said it was a full joy, and He wanted His disciples to have it. The gospel message has made it to our day because they carried forth its message. That means the John 16 joy verse, "Until now you have asked for nothing in My name; ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be made full." (John 16:24), means ask for the Lord's help to live a fruitful life of pointing people to Jesus and helping them follow Him!

Should helping others find their way into God's kingdom be our joy as well? I believe so. In fact, if I make that my greatest joy, greater than the temporary joy of presents, food, and Christmas parties, perhaps I can rescue some joy for my Christmas! If the Lord wants us to ask His help it could be a pretty exciting season! Perhaps that can also help me better focus on the real celebration of Christmas and rejoice in that! How about you and your joy at Christmas?


